WHEREAS, H.R. 38: Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017, which passed the house on December 6, 2017, would force every state to recognize the concealed carry standards of every other state, regardless of the standards, or lack thereof, of that state; and

WHEREAS, the H.R. 38 is in en-route to the U.S. Senate, which is itself considering a similar bill, the Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017; and

WHEREAS, while every state allows concealed carry, each state has different requirements for who is permitted to carry, what requirements are appropriate, and what type of training should be required; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey has some of the strictest firearm laws in the United States of America: and

WHEREAS, private citizens in New Jersey must demonstrate a justifiable need in order to obtain a permit to carry a firearm in New Jersey pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 58-4(d), and a permit to carry a handgun may be issued only to applicant who is "a person of good character who is not subject to any of the disabilities set forth in section 2C:58-3c., that he is thoroughly familiar with the safe handling and use of handguns, and that he has a justifiable need to carry a handgun".; and

WHEREAS, currently, nonresidents in New Jersey must also apply for a permit to carry a firearm from the New Jersey State Police, following the same requirements as citizens of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, despite these stringent requirements, the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 (H.R. 38) and the Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 (S. 446) would force New Jersey to allow any individuals – people with no firearm safety training, people with violent misdemeanor records, convicted stalkers, teenagers, abusive boyfriends, and people with dangerous histories – to carry concealed handguns on the streets of its towns and cities; and,

WHEREAS, twelve states do not require any permit, training or criminal history check to carry a concealed firearm in public, including eight that have repealed their permit requirement in the past three years, and the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 (H.R. 38) and the Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 (S. 446) would force all states to allow permitless carry by residents of these states; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 38 also would roll back the federal Gun-Free School Zones Act, allowing some people with no permit at all to carry a gun in a school zone; and WHEREAS, both bills would override existing state and city laws and severely limit the city's ability to prevent dangerous people from carrying loaded, hidden firearms in public; and

WHEREAS, both bills represent huge federal government encroachment of state rights.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that they do hereby register their OPPOSITION to H.R. 38 and S.446, the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 and the Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017.

TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF ORDINANCE #1850

AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen find it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2018 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and.

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$141,168.66 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the CY 2018 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Wyckoff shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S. A. 40A:4-45, be increased by 1.0% amounting to \$418,155.00 and that the CY 2018 municipal budget for the Township of Wyckoff be approved and adopted in accordance with the ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Direction within 5 days after such adoption.
