WHEREAS, the citizens, residents and commercial property owners (collectively "ratepayers") of the municipalities of Ridgewood, Midland Park, Glen Rock, and Wyckoff are ratepayers in the Ridgewood Water system; and,

WHEREAS, the ratepayers are keenly aware of the cost of treating and distributing drinking water throughout Ridgewood Water system; and,

WHEREAS, the ratepayers recognize the prevalence and potential risks of certain perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) detected in the Ridgewood Water system that affect the quality and health of the primary source of drinking water for ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, neither Ridgewood Water nor the ratepayers polluted the raw water and should not bear the costs to treat the PFAS contamination that they did not cause; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) has enacted a maximum contaminant limit for PFOA of 14 parts per trillion (ppt) and PFOS of 13 ppt; and

WHEREAS, Ridgewood Water exceeds the PFOA and PFOS limits and has been providing test results to NJDEP since 2017; and

WHEREAS, the ratepayers are now a the high-cost nexus of construction costs and debt service in year three of a five-year plan that the DEP approved to remove PFAS from the drinking water of 62,000 customers to non-detect and where the ratepayers are bearing a disproportionate share of these project costs; and

WHEREAS, Ridgewood Water is investing in capital improvements to treat the drinking water to non-detect levels of PFAS chemicals which will require upgrades to multiple treatment facilities and the re-routing of distribution lines throughout the Ridgewood Water system; and

WHEREAS, the ratepayers will continue to be subjected to the significant PFAS capital improvement costs, through rate increases, to fund specific system-wide PFAS treatment projects, operations, and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, Ridgewood Water is actively seeking recourse from the polluters through litigation, where recovery would offset PFAS treatment costs; and

WHEREAS, based on engineering projections and current market procurement assessments, Ridgewood Water will need to raise the current ratepayer PFAS surcharge to complete the PFAS mitigation projects; and

WHEREAS, an appropriation of \$12,000,000 can be utilized by Ridgewood Water to fund construction of the last three PFAS treatment facilities, thereby reducing the annual PFAS surcharge requirement.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF \$634,500 FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THE NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The improvements described in Section 3 of this ordinance are hereby authorized by the Township of Wyckoff, and there is hereby appropriated the sum of money herein stated as the appropriations made therefore and amounting to \$634,500.

<u>Section 2.</u> For the financing of said improvements, and to meet the cost therefore, there is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the Township of Wyckoff, the said sum, being available by virtue of a provision included in the approved 2024 Municipal Budget.

Section 3. The improvements authorized and the appropriations therefore are for the purchase of illuminated school crossing signs, engineering services for road and facility improvements, improvements to public buildings and facilities, purchase of safety equipment for firefighters, hose replacement, purchase recreation program equipment, park and recreation area enhancements, various Town Hall and Public Works complex improvements, public safety equipment, purchase of DPW heavy equipment, police patrol SUV and equipment, radio and radar upgrades, recreation field improvements, Town Hall fire alarm system upgrade, Municipal Town Hall building upgrades and various other capital improvements, and safety enhancements.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.

Said amount of \$30,000.00 shall consist of an appropriation made in the 2024 Capital Improvement Fund in the 2024 Municipal Budget and designated as "Appropriation for future field improvements and safety enhancements". The total appropriation balance is \$284,003.59.

SECTION 3. Said work shall be such as conforms to the recommendation of the Department of Public Works Manager and approved by the Township Committee.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS INCLUDING ROAD RESURFACING, TOWN HALL ROOF REPLACEMENT, ACQUISITION OF A VEHICLE LIFT, ACQUISITION OF A SINGLE AXLE PACKER TRUCK, ACQUISITION OF A SINGLE AXLE JETTER/VAC TRUCK, AND ACQUISITION OF A RECORDS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,937,100 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,452,776 OF BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized, pursuant to the applicable statutes of the State of New Jersey, the capital improvements set forth below in, by and for the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Township"), together with other purposes necessary, appurtenant or incidental thereto or thereof (collectively, the "Authorized Projects"):

SECTION 2. It is hereby determined and declared by this Township Committee as follows:

- A. The estimated aggregate maximum amount of money to be raised from all sources for the Authorized Projects described in Section 1 is \$2,937,100.
- B. The estimated aggregate maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the Authorized Projects described in Section 1 is \$2,452,776.
- C. The Township expects to use (i) funds available in the Capital Improvement Fund in the amount of \$83,700 for certain Authorized Projects, as described in Section 1, and (ii) funds available pursuant to that certain Memorandum of Understanding between

the Township and PSE&G, in the amount of \$400,624, with respect to the Road Resurfacing Project, as described in Section 1; such sums being in the aggregate amount of \$484,324 and being inclusive of the required down payment for said purposes or improvements in the aggregate amount of \$122,638.80, as required by Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). The down payment is now available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. The sum of \$2,937,100, including said down payment of \$122,638.80, is hereby appropriated for the Authorized Projects described in Section 1.

SECTION 4. For the purpose of financing part of the cost of the Authorized Projects described in Section 1, exclusive of said down payment and other available funds described in Section 2, the issuance of bonds of said Township in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding Two Million Four Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$2,452,776) is hereby authorized pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The rate or rates of interest, maturities, method of sale and other details of said bonds not determined herein shall be determined by subsequent resolution or resolutions adopted by this Township Committee pursuant to law.

SECTION 5. Pending the issuance of the bonds authorized in Section 4 hereof, bond anticipation notes of the Township may be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding Two Million Four Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$2,452,776). Each such bond anticipation note shall be designated "Bond Anticipation Note." All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Township; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. All such bond

anticipation notes may be executed in the name of the Township by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and Chief Financial Officer or such other official of the Township as may hereafter be designated by resolution or otherwise as provided by law and shall be under the seal of the Township and attested by the Township Clerk. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver such notes to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest, if any, from their dates to the date of delivery The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Township Committee at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser or purchasers thereof.

SECTION 6. It is hereby further determined and declared by this Township Committee as follows:

A. The Authorized Projects described in Section 1 are not current expenses; they are improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

- B. The weighted average period of usefulness of the Authorized Projects described in Section 1 for which the bonds are hereby authorized to be issued, within the limits prescribed by the Local Bond Law, is 10.3 years.
- C. All bonds or notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed the maximum rate permitted by law.
- D. The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk prior to the passage of this ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey prior to the passage of this ordinance on final reading, and such statement shows that the gross debt of said Township, as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this ordinance by \$2,452,776 and that the issuance of the obligations authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations contained in the Local Bond Law.
- E. The aggregate amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this ordinance to be expended for interest on the obligations authorized herein, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and the costs of issuance of the obligations authorized by this ordinance, including printing, advertisement of ordinances and notices of sale and legal expenses, and other expenses as provided in <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:2-20 does not exceed \$0.

SECTION 7. The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith, and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

SECTION 8. In the event that any other moneys are lawfully received from any source for the purposes provided in this ordinance, such moneys shall be used for the purposes authorized herein and to reduce the amount of bonds or notes authorized to be issued by this ordinance by the amount so received, or if such other moneys are received after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance, such moneys shall be used solely for the payment of the debt service on said bonds or notes as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 9. The full faith and credit of the Township is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on all bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and as long as such bonds or notes are outstanding there shall be levied in each year ad valorem taxes on all taxable property within said Township without limitation as to rate or amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes maturing in said year.

SECTION 10. (a) The Township shall comply with all provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder or applicable thereto (the "Code") applicable to the bonds or notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance and shall not take any action, or fail to take any action, if any such action or failure to take action would cause interest on the bonds or notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance to be or become includable in gross income under Section 103 of the Code or cause interest on the bonds or notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance to be treated as an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code. The Township

shall not directly or indirectly use or permit the use of any proceeds of such obligations or any other funds of the Township, or take or omit to take any action, that would cause such obligations to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Code, and will comply with all requirements of Section 148 of the Code to the extent applicable to the bonds and notes authorized hereby and all proceeds thereof, including without limitation, monitoring compliance with Section 148 of the Code as it applies to the bonds and notes authorized hereby, restricting the yield on the investment of any proceeds or gross proceeds of the bonds or notes to the extent required to comply with Section 148 of the Code, and making payments of the rebate amount, if any, to the United States in the manner and to the extent necessary to comply with Section 148 of the Code.

(b) The Township reasonably expects to reimburse the Township's expenditure of certain costs of the Authorized Projects described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance ("Project Costs") incurred and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. This Section is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Township's official intent to reimburse any expenditure of Project Costs incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in accordance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2(e), and no reimbursement allocation will employ an abusive arbitrage device under Treasury Regulations Section 1.148-10 to avoid the arbitrage restrictions. The maximum principal amount of obligations expected to be issued pursuant to this bond ordinance to pay Project Costs does not exceed \$2,452,776. The Project Costs to be reimbursed with the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized herein will be "capital expenditures" as defined in Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-1(b), a cost of

Treasury Regulations Section 1.148-6(d)(3)(ii)(B). The allocation of proceeds of the bonds or notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance to reimburse Project Costs incurred prior to the issuance of such bonds or notes shall be effected no later than 18 months after the later of the date the Project Costs are paid or the date the Authorized Projects are placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than 3 years after the original Project Costs to be reimbursed are paid.

SECTION 11. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication hereof after final adoption, in the manner provided by law.

ORDINANCE #2013

A CAPITAL ORDINANCE PROVIDING FUNDS BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS AVAILABLE IN THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND – CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND, THE SEWER CAPITAL FUND – CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND, AND THE MUNICIPAL OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND FOR THE PURCHASE OF A NEW FOLEY 926 CAT WHEEL LOADER

WHEREAS, the sum of \$83,000 is presently available in the General Capital Fund – Capital Improvement Fund, \$83,500 is presently available in the Sewer Capital Fund – Capital Improvement Fund and \$105,500 is presently available in the Municipal Open Space Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that such sums should be appropriated for the use outlined herein; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Township Committee that it is in the best interests of the Township to utilize the said sums totaling \$272,000 to finance such improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** The sum of \$83,000 is presently available in the General Capital Fund Capital Improvement Fund, \$83,500 is presently available in the Sewer Capital Fund Capital Improvement Fund and \$105,500 is presently available in the Municipal Open Space Trust Fund as follows:
 - a. Purchase of a new Foley 926 Cat Wheel Loader with a useful life of fifteen (15) years.

SECTION 2. The estimated cost of the improvements and/or purposes is \$272,000.00.

- **SECTION 3.** The Township's capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies.
- **SECTION 4.** If any section, sub-section, paragraph, sentence, or other part of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.
- **SECTION 5.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 6.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.
