AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen find it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2020 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$147,011.06 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the CY 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Wyckoff shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S. A. 40A:4-45, be increased by 1.0% amounting to \$147,011.06 and that the CY 2020 municipal budget for the Township of Wyckoff be approved and adopted in accordance with the ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has made an application to the Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund Municipal Program for Park Improvement and Development to receive grant funds for improvements to the Russell Farms Community Park, Block 377/Lot 18.05; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has received a notice that it is the recipient of a grant in the amount of \$81,000 for the improvements to Russell Farms Community Park; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has entered into a contract with the Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund Program to participate in the receipt of grant funds made available.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Township of Wyckoff, in the County of Bergen shall proceed with improvements to Russell Farms Community Park which shall include; construction and installation of new playground for children ages 2 to 5, paving of gravel parking lot and driveway, purchase, delivery and installation of perimeter fencing and gate around playground, purchase delivery and installation of approved safety grade wood chips ground cover for playground surface, four (4) picnic style benches, purchase and install drainage improved walkway surface on existing chip walkway trail, purchase and install parental responsibility signs to be attached to the playground perimeter fence, purchase and install video surveillance camera system for risk management of area of improvements and purchase and install four (4) deciduous trees.

SECTION 2. The cost of implementing said improvements in Section 1 shall be paid by the Township out of funds to:

- a. \$81,000 to be authorized specifically for said purpose from the Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund Grant Program.
- b. \$81,000 to be authorized from the Municipal Open Space Tax.
- c. Total appropriation authorized is \$162,000.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 186-28 OF THE CODE OF TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, "SIGNS," TO ALLOW TRAFFIC SAFETY SIGNS ON MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY ROADS IN ALL ZONES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that Section 186-28 "Signs" is hereby amended and supplemented to replace subsection 186-28A. as follows:

Section 1 - Section 186, "Signs"

A. Permitted signs. Except as herein provided, it shall be unlawful for any person firm or corporation to erect, enlarge or relocate any sign within the Township of Wyckoff without first obtaining a sign erection permit from the Zoning Administrator. The Zoning Administrator shall issue a sign erection permit only for such signs specifically allowed and provided for by this chapter or for which a previous variance has been granted in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Land Use Law {1} and the ordinances of this municipality. Prior to the erection of all other signs, application shall first be made to the Planning Board for site plan approval and variance approval. However, this chapter shall not apply to such signs as are required by any state, municipal or county health or safety code, rule or regulation, not exceeding two (2) square feet in area or traffic and pedestrian safety signs, with or without flashing illumination for the purpose of calming vehicle speeds recommended by the Wyckoff Chief of Police at strategic locations.

<u>Section 2</u> Except as hereby amended, all other sections of Chapter 186 shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE #1911

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #1878 ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR "MAJOR VEHICLE REPAIRS" AND APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR THE SAID PURPOSE

SECTION 1. Ordinance #1878 for "major vehicle repairs" is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 2. There is hereby allocated and appropriated the sum of \$50,000.00 for major vehicle repairs. Said amount of \$50,000.00 shall consist of an appropriation made in the 2020 Capital Improvement Fund in the 2020 Municipal Budget and designated as "Appropriation for major vehicle repairs".

SECTION 3. Said major vehicle repair shall be such as conforms to the recommendation of the Department of Public Works Manager and approved by the Township Committee.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE #1912

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF \$608,500.00 FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THE NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The improvements described in Section 3 of this ordinance are hereby authorized by the Township of Wyckoff, and there is hereby appropriated the sum of money herein stated as the appropriations made therefore and amounting to \$608,500.00.

<u>Section 2.</u> For the financing of said improvements, and to meet the cost therefore, there is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the Township of Wyckoff, the said sum, being available by virtue of a provision included in the approved 2020 Municipal Budget.

Section 3. The improvements authorized and the appropriations therefore are for the purchase of illuminated school crossing signs, solar powered speed calming signs, engineering services for road and facility improvements, improvements to public buildings and facilities, purchase of safety equipment for firefighters, rescue truck upgrades, purchase recreation program equipment, park and recreation area enhancements, various Town Hall and Public Works complex improvements, public safety equipment, purchase of DPW heavy equipment, police hybrid patrol SUV and equipment, recreation field improvements, Town Hall and Recreation facility security, Municipal Town Hall building and cyber security upgrade and various other capital improvements.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.

SECTION 2. Twelve (12) paid holidays are authorized for full time employees and specific part time employees equal to their daily regular hours of work, excluding seasonal employees.

- **SECTION 4.** All salaries and compensation provided for full time employees provided for herein shall be retroactive (in full or in part) to January 1, 2020. All 2020 salaries and compensation for part time employees hired on or before June 30 of the prior year will receive retroactive compensation (in full or in part) to January 1, 2020, provided they continue to be employed with the Township on July 1, 2020.
- **SECTION 5.** In accordance with Chapter 78, all full-time employees receiving health benefits will contribute the commensurate contribution amount as per P.L. 2011.
- **SECTION 6**. If any section or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to such section or part, and the remainder of the ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.
- **SECTION 7.** This ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication as required by law.
