**WHEREAS**, opioids are commonly prescribed for pain and an estimated 20 percent of patients presenting to physician offices with non-cancer pain symptoms, pain related diagnosis or acute and chronic pain receive an opioid prescription; and,

**WHEREAS,** in 2012, health care providers wrote 259 million prescriptions for opioid pain medication, enough for every adult in the United States to have a bottle of pain medication pills; and,

WHEREAS, although evidence supports the short-term efficacy of opioids for reducing pain, few studies have been conducted to assess long-term benefits of opioids for chronic pain; and,

**WHEREAS**, despite the benefits of opioid pain medication, opioid use presents serious ricks, including the risk of opioid overdose, misuse and abuse; and,

**WHEREAS**, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the abuse of prescription painkillers is a "growing, deadly epidemic"; and,

**WHEREAS,** since 1990, drug overdose death rates in the United States have more than tripled, with nearly three-fourths of these deaths attributable to prescription painkillers; and,

**WHEREAS**, the unprecedented rise in overdose deaths in the U.S. parallels a nearly 300 percent increase in the sale of opioid pain medications, such as Oxycodone and Percocet, since 1999; and,

**WHEREAS**, the chemical structure of opioids mimic the structure of receptors in the brain and the nervous system; and,

**WHEREAS**, this chemical "relationship" allows prescription pain relievers to work by binding receptors in the brain and decreasing the perception of pain, thereby creating a powerful feeling of euphoria, physical dependence and in some cases, addiction; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration reports that many people who become addicted to opioids go on to abuse heroin, a semi-synthetic opioid drug; and,

**WHEREAS**, ninety-four (94) percent of respondents in a 2014 survey of people in treatment for opioid addiction reported they chose to use heroin because prescription opioids were far more expensive to purchase and harder to obtain than heroin on the illegal drug market; and,

**WHEREAS**, of the 21.5 million Americans that had a substance abuse addiction, there were 741 heroin related overdose deaths in New Jersey, twice as many as in 2010; and,

WHEREAS, as reported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, New Jersey's per capita rate of 8.3 heroin related deaths per 100,000 is more than triple the national rate; and,

**WHEREAS**, in 2014, 28,332 people entered New Jersey drug addiction treatment centers for heroin or opioid pill addictions, representing nearly half the overall total of 64,766 people who received substance abuse treatment in the State that year; and,

WHEREAS, heroin overdose has eclipsed homicide, suicide, car accidents and HIV/AIDS as one of the leading causes of death in the State of New Jersey; and,

WHEREAS, the Partnership for a Drug-Free New Jersey, in cooperation with the Community Coalition for a Safe and Healthy Morris, the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse and the Department of Human Services has designated October 6, 2019 as "Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day" in New Jersey; and,

**WHEREAS**, "Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day" is designed to raise awareness about the dangers of and the link between opioid abuse and heroin addiction.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that it joins with the New jersey Legislators and designates October 6<sup>th</sup> as "Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day" in the Township of Wyckoff in order to raise awareness about the dangers of, and the link between opioid abuse and heroin addiction.

#### **ORDINANCE #1887**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 186, "ZONING," OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, ARTICLE VII, "NONCONFORMING USES AND STRUCTURES," SECTION 186-37, "CONTINUANCE OF EXISTING USES AND STRUCTURES"

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that the Code of the Township of Wyckoff is amended at Chapter 186, "Zoning," Article VII, "Nonconforming Uses and Structures," Section 186-37, "Continuance of Existing Uses and Structures."

**SECTION 1** - Chapter 186, "Zoning," Article VII, "Nonconforming Uses and Structures," Section 186-37, "Continuance of Existing Uses and Structures," shall be amended as follows:

Section 186-37. Continuance of Existing Uses and Structures.

- B. Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, where a residence in a residential zone is nonconforming because it fails to meet the minimum lot requirements and/or the minimum yard requirements set forth in the Schedule of Dimensional Requirements, [1] the residence may be added to, provided that such addition does not in itself encroach upon the minimum setbacks or height requirements or exceed the maximum lot coverage requirement (when added to the coverage of other buildings) set forth in the Schedule of Dimensional Requirements. Should the addition itself encroach upon the minimum setback or height requirements or exceed the maximum lot coverage requirements set forth in the Schedule of Dimensional Requirements, a variance shall be required. Where an improvement and/or addition triggers the enhanced side yard setback requirements pursuant to Section 186-66, a variance shall be required where the setback is deficient, even when the improvement and/or addition is not located within such required side yard setback.
- C. Whenever a new principal structure is proposed to be constructed on a non-conforming lot, variance approval from the appropriate land use board shall be required even if the proposed new structure conforms to the minimum requirements contained in the schedule of dimensional requirements.

**SECTION 2** - All other sections of Section 186-37 shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 3 -** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.
