WHEREAS, although rare, childhood cancer is the leading cause of death from disease in American children under the age of 19 and the second leading cause of death after accidents; and,

WHEREAS, very little is known about the causes of childhood cancers but a small percent are known to be hereditary conditions or exposure to diagnostic or therapeutic radiation; and,

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates 11,060 new cases of childhood and adolescent cancer are to be diagnosed in 2019, an increase from 10,590 projected in 2018, however, because of major treatment advances in recent decades, more than 80% of children with cancer now survive 5 years or more; and,

WHEREAS, the effects of childhood cancer therapy can have profound physical, emotional and other consequences; and,

WHEREAS, many survivors and children battling the disease have difficulty readjusting in school and social settings, and many children experience anxiety, body image concerns and are at risk for developing learning difficulties; and,

WHEREAS, there is a need to increase awareness, understanding and compassion among youth for children battling cancer; and,

WHEREAS, The State of NJ has already adopted resolution AJR 106 SJR 49 designating September of each year as "Go Gold for Kids with Cancer Awareness Month"; and,

WHEREAS, Rebecca Salmins, a 7th grader at Eisenhower Middle School in Wyckoff beat cancer, remains in remission and is active in bringing awareness to cancer, assisting other children with cancer and raising money for cancer research and cancer patients; and,

WHEREAS, Wyckoff resident and child, Peyton Sargenti courageously fought childhood cancer and is in remission; and,

WHEREAS, unfortunately Tommy Fitzpatrick, a brave and beloved 6-year-old local lost his strong and courageous battle against brain cancer this year and despite having 7 brain surgeries, managed, with his family, to raise \$50,000 for pediatric cancer research for the Children's Cancer Institute at Hackensack Medical Center with the "# Tommy Strong" campaign through St. Elizabeth's Church in Wyckoff; and,

WHEREAS, Wyckoff is still missing Ben Landel and mourning his sad and untimely death. Ben was a beloved Wyckoff resident and former Ramapo High School student and an accomplished soccer and track athlete who courageously battled an aggressive and rare form of childhood cancer but spread hope and love to many in his short but memorable time he spent in Wyckoff.

TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF

ORDINANCE # 1919

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE A NEW CHAPTER IN THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, CHAPTER 20, "RULES OF DECORUM FOR GOVERNING BODY MEETINGS".

WHEREAS, the public are encouraged to speak at all open meetings of the Township Committee in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, in New Jersey, a citizen's right to speak is established by the Open Public Meetings Act¹; and

WHEREAS, in the 2010 decision in <u>Besler v West Windsor Plainsboro Regional Board of Education</u>², the New Jersey Supreme Court ruled that governing bodies should adopt their decorum rules sufficiently in advance so that the public has reasonable notice and governing bodies my apply these rules in a content neutral fashion without regard to the viewpoint being expressed.³

SECTION 1 - Chapter 20-1, Decorum

Meetings of the Township Committee shall be conducted in an orderly manner to ensure that the public has a full opportunity to be heard and that the deliberative process is retained at all times. This also includes meetings of all boards and other bodies created by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff. The presiding officer shall be responsible for maintaining the order and decorum of meetings.

¹ N.J.S.A. 40A 10:4-12-a provides "...a municipal governing body and a board of education shall be required to set aside a portion of every meeting of the municipal governing body or board of education, the length of the portion to be determined by the municipal governing body or board of education, for public comment on any governmental or school district issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the municipality or school district."

³ The <u>Besler</u> court wrote: "A public body may control its proceedings in a content-neutral manor by stopping a speaker who is disruptive or who fails to keep to the subject matter on the agenda. The government or a school board, however, has the burden of showing that its restriction of speech in a public forum was done in a constitutionally permissible purpose."

SECTION 2 - Chapter 20-2, Rules of Decorum

While any meeting is in session, the following rules of order and decorum shall be observed:

- 1. Rules of Order: Unless otherwise provided by law, Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the conduct of all meetings when necessary. The attorney for the body or the attorney's designee shall act as Parliamentarian.
- 2. Members: The members of the governing body and members of all boards and other bodies shall preserve order and decorum, and a member shall make best efforts not to interrupt or disrupt the proceedings or disturb any other member while speaking.
- 3. Matters Discussed in Closed Session: No person shall disclose in open session the matters discussed in closed session without the expressed authorization of the Municipal Attorney appointed or in accordance with the law.
- 4. Persons Addressing the Meeting: Each person who addresses the meeting shall do so in an orderly manner. Any person who utters physically threatening, patently offensive or abusive language,⁴ or engages in any other conduct which disrupts, disturbs or otherwise impedes the orderly conduct of any meeting shall, at the discretion of the presiding officer or a majority of the members, be asked to refrain from such conduct.
- 5. Audience: No person at a meeting shall engage in disorderly or boisterous conduct, including the utterance of loud, physically threatening or abusive language, or other acts which disturb, disrupt or otherwise impede the orderly conduct of any meeting and the ability of the public to hear or participate. Any person who conducts himself in the aforementioned manner shall, at the discretion of the presiding officer or a majority of the body, be requested to refrain from such conduct.
- 6. Personal Comments: All statements are part of the public record and cannot be redacted.

⁴ Robert's Rules or Order provides that: "In debate a member must confine himself to the question before the assembly and avoid personalities It is not allowable to arraign the motives of a member, but the nature or the consequences of a measure may be condemned in strong terms. It is not the man, but the measure, that is the subject of debate."

SECTION 3 - Chapter 20-3, Public Participation

The public is encouraged to address the members or comment on any governmental issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the Township of Wyckoff during the following portions of the meeting:

- Hearings: The meeting shall be opened for public comment at the appropriate point on the agenda for any hearing with respect to an ordinance or other specific matter required by law. The maximum that any individual speaker shall be allotted is five (5) minutes.
- 2. Open Public Work Session Meetings: During this period of the agenda, a member of the public is encouraged to comment on any government issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the Township of Wyckoff. The maximum that any individual speaker shall be allotted is two (2) minutes for a total public comments period of ten (10) minutes.
- 3. Open Public Business Meetings: During this period of the agenda, a member of the public is encouraged to comment on any governmental issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the Township of Wyckoff. The maximum that any individual speaker shall be allotted is five (5) minutes per speaker.

SECTION 4 - Chapter 20-4, Addressing the Meeting

No person shall address the meeting without first being recognized by the presiding officer. The following procedures shall be observed by persons addressing the members:

- Each person shall step to the microphone provided for the use of the public and shall state his or her name and address; the organization, if any, which he or she represents; and, if during the open public session of the meeting, the subject he or she wishes to discuss. Children under 18 shall not be required to give their last name or address.
- 2. During any hearing with respect to an ordinance or other specific matter required by law, speakers shall limit comments to the specific ordinance or matter on the agenda. Speakers may be requested not to be repetitious.⁵
- 3. All remarks shall be addressed to the body as a whole.

⁵ In the often-cited decision in <u>White v Norwalk, California</u>, a Federal Appeals court wrote: "In dealing with agenda items, the Council does not violate the first amendment when it restricts speakers to the subject at hand".... While a speaker may not be stopped from speaking because the moderator disagrees with the viewpoint the speaker is expressing, it certainly may stop him if his speech becomes irrelevant or repetitious."

SECTION 5 - Chapter 20-5, Curfew

All meetings shall be adjourned by the presiding officer not later than 10:30 PM except the meeting may be extended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

SECTION 6 - Chapter 20-6, Enforcement of Decorum

The rules of decorum set forth above shall be enforced in the following manner:

- 1. The presiding officer shall request that a person who is breaching the rules of decorum to be orderly.
- 2. If, after receiving a warning from the presiding officer, a person persists in disturbing the meeting, the presiding officer may order a temporary recess.
- 3. If the person repeatedly continues to disturb the meeting, the presiding officer may request that person to leave the meeting.
- 4. If such person does not leave the meeting and continues disruptive conduct, the presiding officer may order any law enforcement officer to remove that person from the chambers.⁶
- 5. If a meeting is disturbed or disrupted in such a manner as to make the restoration of order infeasible or improbable, the meeting may be adjourned or continued by the presiding officer or a majority of the members, and any remaining business may be considered at the next meeting.

SECTION 7 - Chapter 20-7, This Ordinance Shall

Take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

⁶ In a 2002 decision (<u>State v Charzewski</u>: 356 N.J. Super 151) a New Jersey Appellate Court ruled that merely being disorderly at a Council meeting was not per se a criminal offense. The court ruled that the speaker's "conduct may have been rude and excessive, but it was not criminal. Not every interruption constitutes a criminal disruption."

TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF

ORDINANCE # 1920

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE A CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE RECEIPT, ACCEPTANCE AND DEPOSIT OF BERGEN COUNTY FUNDS THEREFORE AND TO AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATIONS OF \$30,000.

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has been advised by the Bergen County Road Department that Bergen County road #93, known as Sicomac Avenue, will be paved by Bergen County if the Township of Wyckoff first constructs the remaining curb ramps on Sicomac Avenue between Birchwood Drive and Hawthorne in compliance with New Jersey Department of Transportation's latest construction standards; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has received a notice that Bergen County will reimburse the Township of Wyckoff for its construction costs as well as engineering design costs in accordance with the Shared Service Agreement for County Road Resurfacing dated March 9, 2017 and Bergen County Resolution of Contract Award #410-19, dated April 7, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has entered into a Shared Service Contract with the County of Bergen for Road Resurfacing to participate in the receipt of Bergen County funds made available.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> The Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen shall proceed with the construction of barrier-free curb ramps on Sicomac Avenue between Birchwood Drive and Hawthorne as instructed by the Bergen County Road Department in order to obtain the improvement of road resurfacing on Sicomac Avenue, Bergen County Route #93, from Birchwood Drive to Hawthorne.

SECTION 2: The cost of implementing said improvements in Section 1 shall be paid by the Township our of funds to:

- a. \$30,000 to be authorized specifically for said purpose from the Shared Service Agreement between the County of Bergen and the Township of Wyckoff.
- b. Total appropriation authorized is \$30,000.

SECTION 3: It is hereby determined and stated:

- a. Said purpose is not a current expense. The same is an Improvement which the Township of Wyckoff may lawfully make or acquire and no part of the cost of said improvement has been or shall be specifically benefited.
- b. It is not necessary to finance this authorization by the issuance of obligations by the Township of Wyckoff pursuant to the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey.
- c. The total authorized appropriation in the ordinance is \$30,000.

SECTION 4: The monies which the Township of Wyckoff is authorized to receive pursuant to the terms of the Shared Service Agreement dated March 9, 2017 between the County of Bergen and the Township of Wyckoff, shall, when received, be placed in a capital improvement fund of the Township of Wyckoff for the purpose set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance.

SECTION 5: It is hereby determined and stated that no supplemental debt statement is required to be made and signed in connection with said purpose, since the gross debt of the Township of Wyckoff as defined under the Local Bond Law is not increased by this Ordinance, and no obligations in the matter of notes or bonds are authorized by this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall take effect after publication thereof and final passage as required by law.

ORDINANCE # 1918

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 177 "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF TO ADD NEW SECTIONS "177-57, LOCATION OF ILLUMINATED TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNS," AND "177-58, LOCATION OF POLE-MOUNTED ILLUMINATED TRAFFIC MESSAGING SIGNS," TO GOVERN THE LOCATION OF ILLUMINATED TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNAGE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that new Section 177-57, "Location of Illuminated Traffic Control Signs," and Section 177-58, "Location of Pole-Mounted Illuminated Traffic Messaging Signs," are added as follows:

SECTION 1 - Chapter 177-57. Location of Illuminated Traffic Control Signs

A. <u>Crosswalk signs with flashing lights around the perimeter of the sign</u> are permitted and may be installed at the following locations:

Westbound Wyckoff Avenue on the north curb line at Circle Drive

<u>SECTION 2</u> – <u>Chapter 177-58. Location of Pole Mounted Illuminated Traffic Messaging Signs</u>

A. Pole-mounted illuminated traffic messaging signs equipped with radar and message activated based on the speed of approaching vehicles may be located and installed at the following locations:

<u>SECTION 3</u> - Except as hereby amended, all other sections of Chapter 177 shall remain in full force and effect.
