
Do you think Ramapo recycles?



Taken from the combined "No" and "Sometimes" voters (50).

- They throw the contents of the recycling bins into the trash dumpsters
 - There are no actual recycling cans; there is no separation between recycling and garbage everyone mixes the two in the same bins. I am also pretty sure both bins get dumped in the same dumpster so it doesn't matter.
 - Teachers have told me that it all goes to the same place but I recycle anyway.
- Usually just out of laziness, plain and simple.
 - It's too far away
 - Wherever there's a can, I throw something out, whether it's recyclables or not.
- There's more trash cans available than recycling from what I've seen
 - Not always recycling bins.

- Separate cleaning crew brought in to empty trash and recycling from classrooms and lunchroom
- All waste is collected by Interstate Waste Services and brought to Millenium Recycling in Airmont, New York.


** Disclaimer**

The following photos show the contents of the recycling and cardboard dumpsters outside Ramapo High school, over the course of a couple of weeks.
















How can we overturn this myth?
