Overconsumption



What is overconsumption?

Overconsumption is excessive consumption or use of goods and services (energy, land, water, or materials) that cause harm or detrimental effects to humans and/or the environment.

How does it affect us?

Overconsumption worsens climate breakdown and increases air pollution. It exhausts the planet's life support systems like the ones that provide us with fresh water, and leaves us short of materials that are critical to our health and quality of life.

Why does this matter now?

Overconsumption doesn't just affect our planet negatively, but it also indirectly supports child labor and slavery in other countries. By second hand shopping, we can limit the amount of business those countries get (like china, vietnam, etc.).

Overconsumption



The world's richest people (7%) are responsible for 50% of the world's carbon emissions - while the poorest 50% of people are responsible for just 7% of emissions.

2nd Hand Shopping - the Solution

What is it?

Second hand shopping is simply buying used goods.

Why is it the solution?



- I. Purchasing pre-owned items helps prevent them from ending up in landfills, thereby reducing overall waste generation.
- 2. Conserving resources: Buying secondhand items reduces the demand for new products, which in turn decreases the amount of resources needed for production.

In the United States, now as many as 60 percent of respondents say they have made at least one second-hand purchase in the past year.

The global secondhand apparel market will grow 127% by 2026 – that's three times faster than the global apparel market overall. Also, the U.S. secondhand market will more than double by 2026, reaching \$82 billion.



Common Misconceptions

- Luxury Brands are more ethical or sustainable than fast fashion
 - They use the same sweatshops and employ the same workers as fast fashion companies
 - They rely on polluting fabrics like synthetic fibers
- They are more expensive
 - Most second hand clothes are cheaper than their counterparts
 - Clean Clothes Campaign report that it would cost brands as little as
 IO cents more per T-shirt to give workers a livable wage
- Online returns are sold to other customers
 - It's cheaper for companies to incinerate or throw out the clothes you return rather than inspect them
 - Important to go to a store and try on clothes to be sure they fit and you want them

What is our Project

- We chose to highlight our town's thrift store known as the Wyckoff PTO Economy Shop
- We created a 5-minute video to help promote and showcase what the store offers
