WHEREAS, subsequent to the execution and filing of said Tax Sale Certificate and prior to the commencement of foreclosure proceedings against the property owner's right to redemption of said Tax Sale Certificate, the mortgagor has paid to the Tax Collector of the Township of Wyckoff any and all charges deemed due and owing on the above-described property and the property owner is therefore entitled to a redemption of said Tax Sale Certificate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:5-55.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, that the Tax Collector be, and the same is hereby authorized and directed to cancel and endorse Tax Sale Certificate 16-00004 for redemption effective January 17, 2017 and make refund in the amount of

\$3,053.00 being lien amount of \$535.78, subsequent taxes, and interest in the amount of \$505.22 recording fees in the amount of \$12.00 and a premium of \$2,000.00 to Clemente Enterprises, and deliver said Tax Sale Certificate to the mortgagor for cancellation with the County Clerk in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:5-55.

#17-104 <u>Authorize Shared Service Contract for NJDOH Well-Child</u> <u>Services with the Borough of Waldwick</u>

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff and the Wyckoff Board of Health recommend a shared service as an effective way to provide the mandated NJDOH core service – well-child care services; and

WHEREAS, a shared service with the Borough of Waldwick is recommended for this service.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen State of New Jersey that the shared service with the Borough of Waldwick for the provision of well-child care services is hereby approved for the current year.

#17-105 Amend Summer Camp Fee

WHEREAS, resolution #17-21, adopted on January 1, 2017 established recreation program participation fees for 2017; and,

WHEREAS, the Recreation Director has recommended decreasing item 10, Summer Day Camp, Grades K-4 per week registration cost of \$85.00 to \$65.00 for the week of July 3, 2017 only due to the camp only being open for three days that week instead of the usual 5 days; and,

#17-106 <u>Authorize Shared Service for Acting Municipal Court</u> <u>Administrator</u>

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has received a mandate from Superior Court of Bergen County which requires that the Township Committee make an appointment on a provisional basis of an Acting Municipal Court Administrator to undertake court duties when the Wyckoff Municipal Court Administrator is out of the office on a scheduled and/or unscheduled leave of absence; and,

WHEREAS, the Superior Court of Bergen County in their November 29, 2016 directive requires the Acting Municipal Court Administrator shall be Municipal Court Administrator in another Bergen County Court; and,

WHEREAS, Wyckoff, Franklin Lakes and Oakland already perform cost avoidance through its Cooperative Pricing System and developed a tri-party

shared service to provide the Municipal Court Administrators with more flexibility; and,

NOW THERFOE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that it does hereby authorize the attached shared service to satisfy this mandate; and,

#17-107 Establish Lien for 632 Lawlins Road Block 230/Lot 22

WHEREAS, the residential home and land at 632 Lawlins Road, Block 230/Lot 22 is owned by Alexander Markisz and Edward Markisz; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff has established a property maintenance code known as Chapter 152 of the Code of the Township of Wyckoff; and,

WHEREAS, all the owners of property in the Township of Wyckoff are required to comply with the provisions in Chapter 152 of the Code of the Township of Wyckoff; and,

WHEREAS, adjacent property owners and neighbors have brought property maintenance violations to the attention of the Zoning Administrator and the Zoning Administrator has issued an abatement notice in compliance with Chapter 152 to the owner and mortgagee of 632 Lawlins Rd. The Zoning Administrator has attempted to obtain compliance through letters and telephone calls as detailed on the attached certification with the result that the owner and mortgagee have failed to abate the violations enumerated in the abatement notice; and,

WHEREAS, the property owner has the duty to remove the violations after notice has been issued; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Administrator has filed a certification dated January 18, 2017 (attached as if set forth at length) in compliance with Chapter 152 which certifies the cost of \$ 900.00 as the verified charge to abate certain violations; and,

WHEREAS, the attached certificate with attachments is presented to the Township Committee for their examination and if found correct, to be charged against the lands upon which the violation existed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that they have examined the certification dated January 18, 2017 from the Zoning Administrator and find it to be correct and cause the cost of

\$ 900.00 to be charged against the land, namely Block 230/Lot 22, known as 632 Lawlins Rd. as a lien on the property for the cost to abate the property maintenance violation.

#17-110 <u>Authority to Publicly Bid as a Concession Recreation Sport</u> Skill Development Camp for Lacrosse

- WHEREAS, The Township of Wyckoff considers the provision of Summer Sports Skill development camps a concession defined in NJSA 40A:11-2(37) et. seq.; and,
- WHEREAS, the Township Attorney has opined that the decision by the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board to provide summer sport skill development camps through the use of a private contracted service on and in Township recreational facilities is legally procured through a public bidding procurement; and,

WHEREAS, the following recreation service is provided as a public conveyance under the "police powers" of the Township through a publicly advertised bidding process":

Lacrosse skill development camp and Clinic.

- The benefits of satisfying a community recreational need in-town outweighs the risk of not providing summer programming of this character and caliber.
- Estimated value of each camp is based on the number of participants. A 50 participant minimum camp may result in \$12,500.00 gross revenue with \$1,250.00 of that gross revenue paid to the Township. A 75 participant minimum camp may result in \$18,750.00 gross revenue with \$1,875.00 of that gross revenue paid to the Township.
- Award is based on highest responsive and responsible bidder
- No additional cost is anticipated to provide these programs.
- No endorsement of any camp provider by the Township shall be included in this public bid or stated by the Recreation Director and his staff.
- **WHEREAS,** the Recreation Director has requested the Township Committee authorize public bidding for this camp; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the Township Administrator and Township Attorney have reviewed NJAC 5:34 9.4 and concur with the recommendation.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that authorization is hereby provided to invoke public bidding to implement the above stated sport skill program explained in this resolution in accordance with NJAC 5:34-9.4.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Clerk provide certified copies of this resolution to the Recreation Director and Chief Financial Officer.

#17-111 Authorize Re-bidding Summer Lacrosse Camp

WHEREAS, the Township Committee awarded an extension on September 20, 2016 to North Jersey Lacrosse Camp Inc., for 2017 and 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the Recreation Director has been advised by the President of North Jersey Lacrosse Camp Inc., Jim Hague that North Jersey Lacrosse Camp Inc., will no longer operate; and,

WHEREAS, the Recreation Director recommends that the Township Committee authorize re-bidding for this recreational summer skill camp; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff that consistent with the Recreation Director's recommendation, the authorizes advertised competitive sealed bidding for a summer camp that teaches Lacrosse skills as a component of the programing offered by the Wyckoff Recreation Department.

#17-112 <u>Extended Contract Firefighters Respirator Mandate</u> <u>Compliance</u>

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff awarded a two (2) year contract for Firefighter Respirator Mandate Compliance from May 1, 2015 to April 30, 2017 to Valley Health Medical Group via resolution 2014-293; and,

WHEREAS, the bid specifications and the aforementioned resolution of award included language which allows the Township of Wyckoff at its sole discretion to extend the contract for a two (2) year period if the contract has been provided in our efficient and effective manner; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff is the Lead Agency for Cooperative pricing System Number 176-WCGCPS-WOLF Group; and,

WHEREAS, this competitively bid procurement combines the purchasing volume for the WOLF Shared Service Group and as such this procurement establishes unit prices for system members (Franklin Lakes, Oakland and Wyckoff); and,

WHEREAS, the Wyckoff Fire Chief has recommended the contract extension due to its efficient and effective contract service; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Administrator and Fire Chief concur with this recommendation; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney has approved this procurement; and,

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has issued a Certificate of Available Funds indicating funds are available in the 2017 temporary budget account #17-1-27-340-020; and,

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer in accordance with NJAC 5:30-5.5(d)2 certifies that this contract extension is subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds in future years; and,

WHEREAS, items 1A through G of Section 1 of the bid specification are referenced as if set forth at length and are applicable to this award authorization for the Township of Wyckoff as lead agency and the Boroughs of Franklin Lakes and Oakland as participation members of this Cooperative Pricing System Procurement who shall be issuing their own purchase orders.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-41, a municipality must include an appropriation for "Reserve for Uncollected Taxes" in its annual budget where less than 100% of current tax collections may be and are anticipated; and,

WHEREAS, receipts from the collection of taxes levied or to be levied in the municipality and payable in the fiscal year shall be anticipated in an amount which is not in excess of the percentage of taxes levied and payable during the next preceding fiscal year which was received in cash by the last day of the preceding fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, if tax appeal judgements of the county tax board pursuant to R.S. 54:3-21 et seq. and/or the State tax court pursuant to R.S. 54:48-1 et seq. result in tax reductions for the previous fiscal year, the governing body of the municipality may elect to calculate the current year reserve for uncollected taxes

by reducing the certified tax levy of the prior year by the amount of the tax levy adjustments resulting from those judgements; and,

WHEREAS, Sheet 22 of the Township's Annual Financial Statement for the year 2016 reflects reductions due to tax appeals of \$160,652.00 which when reduced from the 2016 tax levy results in the 2016 tax collection rate being 99.55 percent; and,

WHEREAS, the election of this choice to calculate the "Reserve for Uncollected Taxes" for the 2016 Municipal Budget shall be made by resolution approved by a majority of the full membership of the governing body prior to the introduction of the 2017 Municipal Budget pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey elects to calculate the "Reserve for Uncollected Taxes" appropriation for the 2017 Municipal Budget by reducing the certified tax levy of the prior year by the amount of tax levy adjustments of the county tax board pursuant to R.S. 54:3-21 et seq. and State tax court pursuant to R.S. 54:48-1 et seq. in order to calculate the prior year tax collection rate.

#17-115 Authorize Renewal of Cooperative Pricing system

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has operated Cooperative Pricing System #58WT/WBOE-CPS known as Wyckoff Township/Wyckoff Board of Education Cooperative Pricing System; and,
